Will. Power. 101: Helping You Transition to College Life

In addition to support from your advisor, freshmen at WP participate in an innovative First-Year Experience Program to help you transition to college life. This multifaceted program of structured academic and student support services guides new students as you build the skills to balance your University coursework with other activities and responsibilities.

As a new first-year student, you will participate in weekly Will. Power. 101 student success workshops that provide personal direction to help you navigate college, including study skills and test taking,

development of an academic plan, and structured pathways leading to graduation in four years.

As an exploratory student, you will take multiple classes with other exploratory students in a community of learners. This will help you build a social network right from the start of college and benefit from a schedule with coordinated classes, built-in enrichment activities, and time for additional responsibilities.

Questions to consider when thinking about a major

- What do I love learning about (different cultures, famous authors, mathematical equations, human anatomy, finance)?
- In what type of environment do I picture myself working (corporate, school, hospital, construction, museum, courtroom, lab)?
- Where are my strengths/interests (meeting and talking to new people, helping others, traveling, teaching, performing, working with clients, working with children or the elderly)?
- What knowledge is needed for the type of environment in which I'm interested (biology, human behavior, family dynamics, history, technology) and what skills must I develop (e.g., leadership, persuasion, writing, creative, problem-solving, empathy)?
- What will help me explore and obtain this knowledge and skill (career development counselors, academic advisors, civic engagement opportunities, extracurricular activities)?

Special note about nursing: Freshmen who meet the University requirements for admission, but do not meet the nursing major requirements will be accepted to the University as Exploratory. Students will have the opportunity to reapply to the nursing department after completion of prerequisite coursework. (Please note, however, that due to the competitiveness of the program, admission to the nursing major is neither implied nor guaranteed.)
