

Career communities;


Experiential learning;




Dual Enrollment: A Competitive Recruitment Tool

Building a Dedicated Destination for Adult Learners in SCPE

- Creating a one-stop entry for returning adults seeking credit- and non-credit alternate credentials, professional certifications, and degree completion options:
 - Center for Degree Completion & Adult Learning (DCAL)
 - WP Online UG Student Success Center
 - Professional Certifications
- Building connections and pathways through Credit for Prior Learning (CPL)



Supporting Adult Learners' Needs

This work advances the Adult Learner pillar of our strategic plan:

- Assuring inclusive student success;
- Recognizing adult learners' experience, maturity, and diversity;
- Providing flexibility in recognition of the complexity of adult learners' lives;
- Supporting accelerated pathways to degree completion.



Creating Clearer Pathways to Degrees through Credit for Prior Learning (CPL)

Credit by Examination

- CLEP and other national testing options
- Departmental Challenge Exams

Credit Equivalencies for Credentials

- ACE-recognized credits for professional certificates or licenses
- Military experience
- Police or corrections training


Portfolio Assessment

- Documented professional experience equivalent to course learning outcomes
- Evaluated by faculty



Providing the CPL Adults Seek

- ➤ CPL is associated with better student outcomes and higher graduation rates.
- ➤ National completion rates for adults who earn CPL demonstrate impact (CAEL, 2020).
- Students who earned CPL in 2020 took 17 or more institutional credits compared to those who did not (CAEL, 2020).
- ➤ 84% of adult learners planning to return to college are seeking this option (CAEL, 2022).
- >Accelerates pathways to graduate goals.



"Prospective adult learners are clearly interested in opportunities to earn college credit for what they already know. They understand the concept of CPL, and the vast majority of them have already applied for CPL credit in the past or plan to do so in the future. Institutions with robust CPL programs have what the prospective adult students are looking for." (CAEL, 2022)
