

# **Our Undergraduate Enrollment Story**




First annual UG growth at WP since 2012 (+101)


Turning a corner and positioned to grow with addition of attractive new programs, including to international students, transfer credit alternatives, accelerated opportunities, certificates, and new UCC.

Total UG adult enrollments #3 in NJ (behind Kean & Thomas Edison); top 11% in Carnegie Class; top 21% among all 4-year publics.



# **Our Graduate Enrollment Story**



# Public Institutions in New Jersey – Fall23 to Fall24



# Our First-Time, Full-Time Retention Story





# **PCT: Rebuilding Regional Engagement**



- High successful Job Fairs: 633 attendees & 58 employers/community partners
- Building out new customized training opportunities
- \$1M of NJ DOL grants secured to date, with \$3M more in progress for FY25
- Creating updated curriculum and hiring new instructors for health care programs

#### **Next steps:**

- Engaging with faculty in non-credit program development
- Reanimating Workforce Development programming
- Expanding Continuing Education options for regional employers

# DCAL: Supporting and Engaging Returning Adult Learners

- Securing NJOSHE grant support to engage SCND population: 2<sup>nd</sup> annual grant
  - debt relief, emergency funds, marketing, peer-to-peer connections, experiential learning
- Expanding Credit for Prior Learning (CPL):
  - 2023: 116 students served (213.5% increase over 2022 baseline of 37 students).
  - 2024: 252 students served (54% YOY increase).
  - 2025: Rollout of Credit Predictor software
- CPL relies on faculty subject matter experts:
  - 51 WP colleagues trained summer-fall 2024
  - Additional training planned May 2025

#### **Next steps:**

- Credit Predictor Pro build-out linking certificates to approved credit equivalencies
- Expansion of Challenge Exam Options
- Targeted adult learner on-campus recruitment events



# **WPOSS: Engaging Faculty in Serving Adult Learners**

- Dedicated financial aid and academic advisement team to support rapid expansion of WP Online populations—UG **86** in Fall 2 2021 → **1,208** in Spring 1 2025
- Increasing faculty development to support student success
  - Ongoing 3x/year faculty forums for WP Online undergraduate instructors
  - Fall 2024 WP Online Working Group recommendations
    - Developed Regular and Substantive Interaction Policy draft
    - Created recommendations for effective course shell maintenance
    - Advanced goals for ongoing faculty supports
  - Working with Center for Teaching Excellence to offering new centralized resources

# **Predoctoral Fellowship Program**

- 2025-2027: 3 fellowships in Computer Science, Urban Planning, and Digital Business
- 3rd cohort of highly successful faculty development program:
  - 100% of previous fellows earned their doctoral degrees
  - 86% are already in tenure-track positions
- Innovative teaching fellowship program is increasing WP standing nationally

#### William Paterson University Launching New Round of Predoctoral Fellowships (2025-2027)

The predoctoral fellowship program at William Paterson University supports advanced-standing doctoral candidates who desire a teaching career at an institution that emphasizes teaching quality and encourages multiple forms of scholarship. The program invests in the success of predoctoral students from underrepresented backgrounds at the institutional or disciplinary levels. Departments mentor fellows and provide similar levels of research support as for tenure-track faculty. The fellows teach and participate in a cohort experience designed to position them for success in a tenure-track appointment at William Paterson or other institution of higher education after degree completion.





#### **Badge Description**

The Audio Broadcasting Certificate develops newsgathering and interviewing skills and teaches students: to create content that engages, informs and influences audiences; to acquire high quality audio using mobile devices as well as industry-standard technology; to distribute content across audio and digital platforms; and to practice legal and ethical behaviors when creating television video news content. Individuals who complete the Certificate will learn the technical skills necessary to obtain high quality audio in the field and edit that content independently or in collaboration with a reporter. Last, with the increasing popularity of podcasting, this Certificate will also be valuable to those seeking employment in podcasting, either on-air or behind-the-scenes in production, editing, and writing.

The certificate complements any academic major or current career, including Communication majors, Journalism majors and Film, Television and Audio majors looking to deepen their knowledge and practice of audio broadcasting, as well as adult learners and professionals who wish to acquire audio broadcasting skills.



Milestones is our new digital badging system.

First set of badges for all students earning an undergraduate certificate will be issued in the next month.

Certificate completers will be celebrated at an event later this semester.

# Continuing Focus on Career Preparation In Collaboration with Career Development Office

- Students enrolled in majors with required Experiential Learning: 65%
- Students enrolled in majors with Career Preparation integrated with course requirements: 78%

- Faculty/Departments can work with Career Development to access appropriate job simulations for students
- Non-credit courses available soon to document and recognize (on transcript and with digital badging) experiential learning and non-credit internships
